Test Administration Instruction

1. Take with you:
 - A. Enough copies of Test 1 and Test 2 for all students in class with all of the school information filled in. Keep the tests secure.
 - B. Sharpened pencils, rulers, and erasers, a pencil sharpener, a watch, stapler, and staples. One red pen.
 - C. Enough teacher questionnaires for the day.
2. Before the test, give the teacher questionnaire to the teacher and ask him/her to leave the class during the exam.
3. Arrange students so they cannot copy from one another. If they go outside, ask the students to bring their pencils with them.
4. Introduce the purpose of the test. Say the following:

SAVE THE CHILDREN IS DOING A STUDY TO IMPROVE THE SCHOOL PROGRAM. YOUR CLASS HAS BEEN SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THAT STUDY. TODAY I WILL ASK YOU TO HELP BY ANSWERING QUESTIONS ABOUT MATH AND PASHTO. THE TEST WILL NOT COUNT FOR YOUR GRADE. PLEASE DO THE BEST JOB YOU CAN.
5. Explain the rules.

I will now hand out the questions. I will also had out pencils to students who need them, erasers, and rulers to share. I will collect the pencils, erasers, and rulers at the end of the test. First, please fill in the first page. You need to write your name, age, sex, and the language you speak at home where it asks you for this. Please do this now.

The first part has math questions. Then there is a blank page, followed by Pashto questions. There are several versions of the test, so do not copy from your neighbor because the answer will not be right for you. Please listen carefully to the rules of the test that I will tell you now.

1. **Please do not talk to the other children while we are doing this activity.**

2. If you need to go to the bathroom or get a drink of water during the test, please get up quietly and do so, and then return to your seat. Do not disturb the other children.
3. If you have questions, please raise your hand and I will come to you. You may ask questions if you cannot read the question, if the printing is too light to read, or if you are confused about what you are supposed to do. Do not ask questions about how to get the answer, or whether you have the right answer. Just do the best that you can.
4. Some of the questions will be easy for you. Some will be harder. If you come to a question that you have trouble with, pass it by and go on to the next. When you are finished with all of the other questions, you can come back and work more on the hard one.
5. The first section is math. Each question is numbered. Some questions have a part A and a part B. Each question has a short line to write your answer on.
6. The questions about fractions have a picture of the fraction as well as a number to help you. The picture shows the same information as the number. ???
7. Please turn your test to question 13. This question has a long line and a short line. You are asked to measure the long line only, and to write the answer on the short line.
8. Please turn to Question 4 on the Pashto test. You are asked to read this section. On the next page, you are asked questions about this reading. The first three questions just ask you to identify the correct answer. In the next part, there are 4 statements that are either true or false. On the space for the true answers, write S. on the space the wrong answers, write E.

6. After 60 MINUTES is finished, ask the students to start on the Pashto section, if they have not already. They may return to the math questions they have not finished after they complete the pashto section. Allow 40 minutes from this point to complete the test.
7. When the students are finished, collect the tests. Check to make sure that the student information and all school information is on the test.
8. Collect the teacher questionnaire from the teacher. Check to make sure that all questions are answered.
9. Answer any questions that the teacher may have about the process.
10. Put all tests and teacher data into an envelope. Write the name and number of the school on the envelope. Below the school number, write:

11. Put the envelopes from all sections of the same school together.

CORRECTING

1. Correct only one class at a time, and complete one class before opening the next class envelope.
2. Check to make sure that the Math and Pashto tests from the same student are together.
3. Select one answer code sheet per student.
4. Write the Student ID number from the answer sheet onto the cover sheet of the test. Each student should have only one ID number.
5. Write all of the school and teacher information from the test onto the answer code sheet. Use the school and teacher codes in the Code Sheet.

6. Use a MASTER ANSWER sheet for correcting the test. Please be careful that you are using Answers for Test 1 with Test 1, and answers for Test 2 with Test 2.
7. Correct the tests. Read the correct answer on the answer sheet, mark the TEST correct with a check. Be sure that each check is next to the appropriate question, so that it is clear which question is correct. Example: Check next to 1a, 1b.
8. All questions are either right or wrong. No partially correct answers are allowed. ALL acceptable correct answers are included on the answer sheet.
9. Put the answer sheet and the corrected test together for each student.
10. When all tests are corrected, return them to the envelope and put an X next to CORRECTED on the envelope for that class, as below.

CODING
